Georgia Monroe County, In the name of God, I, Edward Freeman of
County and State aforesaid, being now in health
but of sound mind and disposing memory and
-ling to mind the uncertainty of Death, do make
ordain and constitute this to be my last Will
Testament, hereby revoking all other and former
Wills by me made,
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Martha Freeman - four Negroes, by the names of
Dolly, Wmmy, Mallinda and Cassin, and the heirs
Sole of said Negro live on, it being part of
Lot No 28 in the fifth district of Monroe
County, and one Sole of said Negro as No. 9 in
first district of originally Henry now Butts County
Together with all the Stock and Household
Kitchen furniture to her her heirs and assigns
forever and to be disposed of as she may think
proper, and all the rest and residue of my
Slaves Lands and all and every kind of property
whatsoever, I give to my beloved wife
during her natural life, and after her death
to be disposed of as is herein after named
I know 2nd I give and bequeath to my nephew Robt
Freeman after the death of my wife
Negro Boy Callie and
I know 3rd I give and bequeath to my niece

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Ababella Freeman a negro Boy by the name
of Daw and a Girl by the name of Matilda (after
the death of my wife)

Item 4th I give and bequeath (after the death of my
wife) to my Nephew John Forsyth Freeman, a
negro Boy by the name of Eligah.

Item 5th I give and bequeath my Nephew Henry
Freeman one lot of Land No. two hundred and
eighty-one in the fourteenth district of the County
of Wilkinson (after the death of my wife)

Item 6th I give and bequeath (after the death of
my wife) to my niece Pamela Freeman one
hundred dollars.

Item 7th I give and bequeath (after the death of
my wife) to my nieces Edg. Winkfield Free-
man, and Caroline Augustus Freeman one lot
of Land No. fifty in the Twentieth district of For-
merly Lee now Randolph County to be equally
divided between them (after the death of my
wife)

Item 8th I give and bequeath (after the death of
my wife) to my beloved Mother, and all
pieces, my surviving Brothers and Sisters one Dollar a
piece.

Item 9th my Will and desire is that should any
of my nieces or nephews (to wit, Robertson Freeman,
Ababella C^l Freeman, John Forsyth Freeman,
Edg. Winkfield Freeman, Pamela Freeman, Caroline
Augustus Freeman and Henry Freeman, die
without lawful issue, that in that case their
part or portion to be equally divided amongst
those of them that are living.

Item 10th My Will and desire is that my beloved wife
Nanthena Freeman be my executrix, to carry this
my last Will and Testament into execution, and I
do hereby nominate and appoint her as such, in
witness whereof, I have hereunto set
my hand and this 14th day of January 1832
