But of perfect mind and memory and calling
to mind the Mortality of Body and knowing that it
is appointed for all men ^{over} to die do make this my
last will & Testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul
into the hands of almighty God who gave it and
my Body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in Decent Christian Burial at the Direction of my
executors and as touching such worldly estate as
it hath please God to bless me with in this world
I give and bequeath dispose of the same in the following
manner and form (to wit) First my will and
desire is that all my Just ^{& lawful} debts be paid out of
my estate I then do I give and bequeath to Polly Parm-
-ly Polly & her but now Polly & McMullin whom
I call my Lawful and Loving wife the plantation
whereon I now reside it being part of Lot No 983
Two Hundred and thirty two Containing one hundred
and a mind acres be the same more or less it lying and
being in the County of Monroe together with all my
Stock of Horses Cattle & Hogs - and plantations tools house
Pots and Kitchen Furniture to be her dower and enjoyed
during her widowhood or until my youngest son William
shall become of age then the aforesaid mentioned
property all to be sold and the proceeds of said be
equally divided between my wife and mine children to
namely Polly & McMullin James Monroe McMullin
my eldest son Sarah my only Daughter and William
my youngest son then and there alike but if my
wife Polly & McMullin should marry before my
youngest son William becomes of age the above
mentioned property shall then be sold and divided
as aforesaid I then do my will and desire is that
all the money I have in interest remain on Interest
until it gain a sum sufficient to purchase a
Negro which Negro if purchased shall be
thrown into my estate for use and benefit of my
family - and disposed of in the same manner as before
mentioned to them and their heirs forever I then do
my will and desire is that these sets of land shall

— I have and claim in the purchases namely one
in. Muscogea and one in Lee and one in early
granted out of the money due me of which
I have sold and then to remain until my young
son William becomes of age then to be sold
and equally divided as aforesaid and I hereby
appoint and ordain my Brother Nail McMullen
executor of this my last will and Testament
