I, Frederick Crowder of the State of Georgia and County of Monroe, being in Sound Health, both in Body and mind, but calling to mind the mortality of my body, do make and stand this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following. I will first of all that all my Just debts paid.

I will to my eldest son Samuel Crowder one dollar in addition to what I have already given him to his heirs and assigns forever.

I will to my daughter Rebecca White and Elbary Berry one dollar each in addition to what I have already given them to their heirs and assigns forever.

I will to my beloved wife Milly Crowder - all my personal property, also two negro girls Polly Eliza and Fanchetta and at my wife's death I will to my son James W. Crowder one negro girl Fanchetta and her in case also one Fanchetta bed and Furniture. I will to my son Frederick L. Crowder one negro girl Eliza and her in case together with all my personal property of every kind at the death of my wife.

of this this life do make this my last will and
testament. In manner following. I recommend
my soul to Eternal Creator looking for a joyful
resurrection through the Redeemer my body to be given
to the earth in a decent Christian burial at the Disposal
of any Executors hereafter named and as to my worldly
estate with which God in his mercy has blessed me
I dispose of it as following
1st All my just debts be paid
2nd I give to my brother William for his trouble
in collecting and settling the City of our
Co-partnership business five hundred Dollars
and he whom I consider and trust man and has
charge of the mortgage book will make a fair certificate
of all concerns in which him and myself are engaged
the articles of our Co-partnership are in the hands of
Benjamin B. Smith of this County. The said William
is acquainted with my affairs as an administrator on
the Estates of William Brown & John Lofley dec'd the
papers are in the possession of my wife & she is requested
to give them to my Executor when called for.
3rd I have written to James Walling who lives in Isle of
Wight County Virginia to come to my plantation for
1827/13 Certificate of the County where I at present
live and own. I who married my wife I give to him
I give forty acres of land to be taken off of the
East Corner of the above mentioned tract in 182
to take in Spring at said corner
My Executors are fully authorized to make good
Wills to him for life
