 make known that the following is my last will and testament
 Item 1st To my beloved wife Mary Johnson I hereby give a
 negro man manfred, a negro girl minnie, and seven
 and fifty dollars in money to be raised
 as hereafter directed which money is to be laid out in the
 purchase of Land for the use of my wife and the family
 she may have it is also my will, that my wife have all
 the household and kitchen furniture, together with the entire
 stock of Hogs, horses, cattle, plantation tools & much the
 exception of that part of the same hereafter disposed

Item 2nd To my oldest son William Johnson I give a
 negro boy by name of Ben, which he has already in possession
 I have already given him money which will make his
 part equal to the share I shall make to my other
 children.

Item 3rd To my beloved daughter Seneca Long I do give
 a negro woman by the name of Rachel, and a negro
 girl Mary which she has in her possession - these negroes
 together with money and other things which she has and
 share equal to what I give to my other children.

Item 4th To my beloved daughter Martha Brown I hereby give
 a negro woman Rhoda, and a negro girl Grace and a
 boy by the name of George, together with other things which
 she has and make her share equal with my other chil-
 dren.

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Item 5th To my beloved son Thomas Johnson I do hereby

give a negro boy by the name of Adama and Nancy, one horse, saddle and bridle feather bed and furniture two cows and calves and two hundred dollars in money.

Item 6th To my beloved son Gabriel Johnson I do hereby give Moses and Henry, one horse, saddle and bridle one feather bed and furniture two cows & calves and one hundred dollars in money.

Item 7th To my beloved daughter Mary Johnson I do hereby give Mary and Betty, one horse saddle, saddle and bridle, one feather bed and furniture two cows and calves and one hundred dollars in money.

Item 8th To my beloved daughter Rebecca Johnson I do hereby give Sarah and Melly and John, one horse saddle and bridle, one feather bed and furniture two cows and calves.

Item 9th To my beloved daughter Sarah Johnson I do hereby give March and Minimus four children my children David, Mariah, Francis, one feather bed and furniture one horse saddle and bridle two cows and calves.

Item 10th It is my will and pleasure that the balance of my negroes not herein before disposed of, shall be kept together under the control and management of my wife for the support and education of my young children until the youngest of them becomes of age - they are then to be equally divided amongst all of my children. Nothing in the balance shall be so construed as to affect the negroes given to my wife in the first item of this will.

Item 11th It is my will and pleasure that all my lands be sold real face for either cash or credit, as my executor may think best out of the proceeds of which five thousand dollars shall be applied to the purchase of land for the use of my wife and the family. The balance of the money to be equally divided amongst all of my children.

Item 12th It is my will and pleasure that all the money which I have on hand and which may be collected from debtors be equally divided amongst all of my children.

Item 13th It is my will and pleasure that all the property which I have in this will given to my wife be enjoyed by her during her life, but at her death it is to be equally divided amongst all of my children.

Item 14th It is my will and pleasure that my

beloved wife Mary Johnson and my son Thomas Johnson
and my son-in-law Archibald Lang as my executors
and trustees to carry into effect the foregoing will.

have one negro girl by the name of Mary and twenty dol
lars in cash and one bed and furniture and that my son
William Lhanency shall have two negro girls & a girl.
