will & bequeath also that no wife shall have the right of cultivating
the ground on my rocky creek plantation that has been cleared this
year adjoining Long & Andrews for two years

382 - I will & bequeath to the executors Thomas in trust for
James Comer, Adeline Comer & Virginia Comer children of
Amanda Comer & for any others she may have hereafter the
following property (viz) 120 acres of better quality lying on
the waters of rocky creek adjoining a Long & Andrews and
adjoining with the reservation were reserved for the benefit
of my wife. Also one woman named Stella & a woman
named Solenne a boy & an ear given to me in trust for the
benefit of his children by John & Comer which trust is
recorded in the office of the Superior Court Clerk. I will
& direct also that my trustee pay over to my wife Prudence
& Chapman three hundred dollars with interest from 1st of last May
when it can be conveniently parted from this property. I will
& desire also that my daughter Amanda & her issue shall be
supported of this property during her life time & that at her
death or above specified this property be equally divided between
her children that may survive her. I will & bequeath also to
my executors Thomas in trust for James & Comer Adeline Comer
& Virginia Comer & any other children my daughter Amanda
& her issue may have hereafter that portion of property that
should legally fall to the share of Amanda & her issue at
