the certainty of death, but being now thankful to God of
sound and disposing memory, I do make, publish, & ordain
and Territory aforesaid, do make, ordain, publish and declare
this to be my last will and testament in manner & form
following, to wit:

First - I commit my soul to God who gave it, and
do hereby request & desire that my body be interred
in a decent & Christian manner.

Item 1st. My will and desire is that all my personal property
be kept together and worked under the entire control
of my widow & executor until my just debts are paid
