received it. My body I wish decently buried. And as to such property
as it hath pleased a kind Providence to bestow upon me I dispose
of in the following manner, viz,

First. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Ann for and during
her natural life two negroes, Lee and Ritta, the land on which
I now live, the household and kitchen furniture, one horse and
wagon, two cows & calves and twelve head of hog. After the
death of said named wife, the above mentioned property to be equally
divided between my two daughters Patsy, & Charilla for their own
benefit during their natural life; and at their decease to be equally
divided between their children.

2^d Whereas I have heretofore given to John Hitt the husband of my
daughter Patsy fifty six acres of land with two hundred
cows, one negro girl named Linda worth one hundred dollars,
one mare and saddle worth sixty dollars, one bed & bedstead
furniture worth thirty dollars, one Cow calf whifer worth twenty
dollars and one chest worth four dollars, and whereas I have
given to my daughter Charilla one bed & bedstead worth thirty
dollars, one saddle worth fifteen dollars, one negro girl named
da worth five hundred dollars & also a set of two hundred
cows paid Dr. Head for Lyons the husband of said Charilla. And my
will wish and desire is, that all of the remainder of my property
real & personal which I may die possessed of shall at my death
for all my last debts have been paid, from property which can
be spared) be equally divided between my said two daughters
& Charilla (subject to the Mortgage which I have heretofore
made on the land which is named above) for their use & benefit during their
natural lives, and at the decease of either of my said
daughters the property received from my estate shall be
equally divided among and between their children.
