Will 1st I give and bequeath to the wife of the said James Pinckard all my real and personal estate to be divided into six equal parts amongst my six children

Will 2nd I leave all my property both real and personal to be divided into six equal parts amongst my six children and amongst two families of my grand children (10y)

Will 3rd I give my son John Pinckard the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 4th I give my son James Pinckard the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 5th I give my son Thomas Pinckard the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 6th I give the daughter Elizabeth Pinckard the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 7th I give to the children of my deceased daughter Judith H. Babney the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 8th I give to the children of my deceased son James Pinckard the one sixth part of all my property both real and personal

Will 9th I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons John Pinckard and Peyton Pinckard the whole and joint executors of this my last will and testament

Will 10th I leave all the property and money which my deceased daughter Judith H. Babney child shall get out of my estate in the hands of my executors, namely John and Peyton Pinckard and they are to have the entire care of that property or money until the children become of full age and it is my wish that they should do so and it is my property that it may be gained as guardian should do

With H^h I leave all the property and money which my deceased son James Pinckard children shall get out of my estate in the hands of my executor namely John & Peyton Pinckard and they are to have the sole care of that property or money until the children become of full age and it is my wish that they should so manage their property that it may be gaining as guardians should.
