I before God & the County and State aforesaid being weak in body but I still have an disposing mind and memory, and Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, at to the last that I may be better prepared to leave this world whenever it shall please God to call me hence do therefore make & declare this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made. As to this & principally I commit my soul into the hands of God & let it into my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner.

and as to such worldly estate here with it hath pleased a Kind Providence to me to dispose of the same as followeth

Item first. It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid by my executors hereinafter named and appointed out of any estate as soon conveniently may be after my decease.

Item second. It is my will and desire that all my personal estate be kept together by my beloved wife Delilah Pope, during her life time or widowhood, or until my eldest Child arrives at full age, or one of my Children marry, the same to be under her entire control and management, at the at the same time giving my executors full power to sell and dispose of such part or portion as my wife may not choose or wch to keep, to be sold at her or our own direction, in such manner and at such times as my executors may think best for the interest of my estate, and in the event of my said wife's marriage it is my will and desire, that all my estate then on hand to me and personal, be divided between my said wife and Children each having Share and Share alike and in the event of my said wife's death before marriage it is my will and desire that all my estate then on hand both real and personal be equally divided between my children share and share alike. And it is further my will and desire, that on the coming of age of my eldest Child, or on the marriage of either of my Children during the lifetime and before the marriage of my said wife, that then my Monroe County Wills be set off and advance to such Child, such part or portion as she may think proper not to exceed the www.georgiaoldrecords.com part of the value of said estate.

Item third. Inasmuch as my beloved wife Delilah Pope nowe to me to be true to the best of my knowledge

desire that my executors make sale of my real estate in the town of Forsyth whenever my said wife may desire it and on such terms as they may deem most to the interest of my estate, which real property consists of this House and lot wherein I now reside, containing some seven acres. The house wherein John S. Harris now resides & known as the Platonic Shop - and one vacant half acre lot adjoining I have sold & one vacant acre lot adjoining Mrs. Dunn, but my will is to have the possession, and control of all said property in this item mentioned as long as she may do during her life time or widowhood - at the termination of either said property or the proceeds thereof to subject to such division as mentioned in Item second.

Item Fourth - I desire and request that my executors sell and dispose of all my other real estate, at such times and on such terms as in their opinion may be to the interest of my estate, unless my said wife may desire to keep a portion thereof for her support & the support of my children which it is my desire for her to do if she may so wish, during her lifetime or widowhood, at the termination of either said property or the proceeds thereof to be subject to such division as mentioned in Item second - & which real estate other than that mentioned in the last item consists of four hundred acres of land in Autauga County, Alabama, one lot near Forsyth containing one hundred & eighty two acres, one lot adjoining Wiley Barn in Monroe & an undivided interest in Mrs. Packard's estate and one thousand a lot in Merriweather County known as the gold lot.

Item Fifth - It is my will and desire that my executors shall for my beloved wife Delilah Pope a plantation that she desire it in such place and at such time as in my request - and said plantation, so purchased with all its plantations shall be under the entire control & management of my said wife during her lifetime or widowhood and at the termination of either that said plantation to be subject to such division as mentioned in Item second.

Item Sixth - It is my will and desire, and I do give and bequeath it that any portion of my estate devolved to me of my daughters Sarah T. Pope and Charlotte A. Pope by my wife during her widowhood will share of my estate of 1834 A.D. or either of them may be entitled to receive under the division of my estate as mentioned in Item second be and the same to this sum is hereby vested in my executors in trust and for the use of my said daughters

no wise to be subject to any debts or liabilities of any future husband either of them may have but the same to remain to their use & the use of their Children. Should they have any -

Item seventh - Having the most entire and unlimited confidence in the prudence and good judgment of my beloved wife Delilah Pope I intrust to her the management and control of the Children and intrust their education entirely to her direction, during her life or widowhood, and should she die or marry before all my children become of age, it is then my desire that the Court of Ordinary appoint proper persons as the guardians of their persons and property.

Item eighth - I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Delilah Pope Executrix, & my trusty friend John J. Pinckard executor to this my last will & testament - this 11th day of October 1824 - the same being contained on pages 1, 2, 3, 4, 5.
