I John Rogers being in sound mind and disposing memory but knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and publish this my last will and Testament.

1st When I die I wish my body to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors

2nd I will that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate

3rd I will that all my property of every description remain in the hands of my beloved wife Mary Ann Rogers as long as she lives and when she dies to be disposed of as hereafter directed

4th I will that at the death of my said wife that my Grand Daughter Nancy Ann Amanda Rogers have a certain negro woman that I own by the name of Sarah about twenty years old and her two children Jeff and Jim and the increase that may arise from said negro woman to have them forever

5th I will my Grand Son John Richard Rogers have my negro man Sam a thirty years of age to have him forever

6th I will that my Grand Daughter Mary Ann P. Rogers have my negro woman Hannah about thirty years of age to have her forever

7th I will that my Grand Son William M. Rogers have my negro man about seventeen years old to have him forever

8th I will that my Grand Son James A. Rogers and my Grand Daughter Ann Rogers have the price in money each of them to make them equal to the amount that I have given to the rest of their brothers and sisters with the exception of Nancy A. Rogers I allow her to have more than any of the rest of them

9th At the death of my said wife I will that all my property not before disposed be sold and all the effects that may arise after the distribution is made that I have heretofore ordered in my will to be equally divided among my said Grand Children so as to make their shares all equal with the exceptions of my said Grand Daughter Nancy A. Rogers I allowing her more than the rest on account of her services living with me I mean that she shall have her full share in the said children

10th I make herein and affirm that this my last will and Testament is my last will and Testament

Signed sealed and published in presence of this 11th day of January 1823 the word "Rogers" in the fourth
