Being of sound mind but feeble in body, I am convinced that my life is fast approaching its close. I do therefore affirm this to be my last will and testament.

First. I will and desire that my entire estate both real and personal shall be kept together under the control of my beloved wife Frances H Colbott until the entire amount of my indebtedness is paid. After my debts are all paid I wish the following distribution made of my property. Namely, I wish my wife Frances H Colbott to keep the entire amount of my stock including hogs, cows & horses together with the household & kitchen furniture including beds, tables, chairs, looms &c. for the benefit of herself ~~and~~ my minor children. I moreover will and bequeath to my beloved Frances H Colbott my house ~~and~~ lot of land No 185, for a home for her and my children during their minority ~~and~~ to her during her natural life ~~and~~ then to be sold and equally divided between my children at her death.

Secondly. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances H Colbott during her natural life my negro girl Maria her children ~~and~~ ~~and~~ and at the death of my beloved wife I will and desire my girl Maria & children to be equally divided between my children.

Thirdly. I will and desire after my debts are paid that the property No 169 including sixty acres more or less be sold at the auction before the Court house door in Forsyth Monroe Co. and the proceeds of said sale be cash or otherwise as my beloved wife ~~Frances H Colbott~~ may think best, and the proceeds to be equally divided between my children.

Fourthly. I will and desire that the remainder of ~~my~~ property be kept together on the premises and under the control of Frances H Colbott for the purpose of enabling my wife ~~Frances H Colbott~~ to support my children, and as the children ~~shall~~ grow up or marry that said property shall be entitled to each one ~~as~~ ~~as~~ attained the years of majority his individual portion ~~of~~ ~~as~~ given him ~~or her~~

Fifthly. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife for her benefit and the benefit of my children during their minority the entire amount of my plantation tools including Gun, Fire, etc. also to my shop tools &c. That is my wagon & cart horses

any of my Carpenter tools that she may think proper to so do.
