I the said John Standard of the county of Monroe and state aforesaid have thought proper to make this my last will and testament and do by these presents ratify and confirm every part and clause thereof underwritten making the same binding on myself heirs and assigns and every person or persons who shall hereafter

1st It is my will that I give my sole to God who gave it and my executors hereafter named at my death to have my body decently buried and have my funeral rights performed agreeable to usual customs of the Methodist Episcopal Church

2nd It is my will that my beloved son Benjamin F Standard and daughter of Malorie be my lawful executors to carry this my will in full effect

3rd It is my will that all the goods and chattels lands and tenements that I am possessed of at my death be the property of my beloved wife Martha Standard during her widowhood or life time first having my just debts first paid out of the same and all expenses relative to closing this my will

4th It is my will that my executors in paying of my debts if it should be necessary to sell any of my goods chattels for that purpose that they would select such property as will least impair the land and from whereon my beloved companion residing to her and my executors to select such property as will appear best suited for that purpose

5th It is my will that my three daughters now single daughters when they become of age or be married then they are to receive one bed and furniture from my beloved wife and my executors in to me this part of my will be carried into effect

6th It is my will that at the death of my beloved wife that the property in her possession be equally divided among the children born of the body of my beloved wife Martha Standard or their legal descendants and no others

7th It is my further desire that if my beloved wife should think proper to take up Sara Wupling at any time that my executors sell all the estate remaining in her hands and maintain her out of the money during her life time in such manner as will most be to her convenience and comfort and then the balance to be distributed agreeable to the 6th clause of this my will

8th It is my will that the minor sons Fleming Standard and Nancy Standard shall stay and work for their mother till they arrive at the age of twenty years then they
