4th To Sarah Ann Watson the Widow and eldest of my son Alexander M. Watson I give and bequeath the Sum of Ten Dollars

5th To Sarah J. Watson the Widow and eldest of my son William B. Watson and to her three Children I give and bequeath the Sum of Ten Dollars to be Equally divided among them.

6th I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Watson all the residue of my property, both real and personal of all kinds whatsoever to be fully and freely used and Enjoyed by her and to be at her entire disposal by gift or Will or in any other ^{lawful} manner that may be to her most agreeable. In testimony whereof I the said John Watson Senior have hereunto set my hand and my name in the presence of the under Written Witnesses this ninth day of July in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty.

Seventh and acknowledged in the presence of us who at the request of the said John Watson Senior and in his presence and in the presence of each other subscribe the same as attesting Witnesses the day above Written the word "Wife". Intended to be signed.
