aforesaid being in sound mind and proper mind and
memory, but weak in body, thanks be to God for the
same, calling to mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men
to die, do make and ordain this my last will and
testament and by this revoking all others, that I do
say, first of all I recommend my soul to God who
gave it and my Body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in a Christian like manner at the discre-
tion of my Executors, nothing doubting but that
at the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the power of the Almighty God, and
touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have been
pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give
devise and bequeath of the same in the following
manner viz. 1st I will and bequeath that
all my just debts be first paid,

2nd I will and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Agnes Moore all my ready money
and notes of hands and my house hold fur-
-niture for her support during her life or wid-
-owhood — 3rd after the death of my wife
Agnes Moore I will and bequeath that all
the remaining part of my Estate both real
and personal and ready money and notes
be equally divided into four Equal parts
between Lavinia Moore, Moses Moore, Eliza-
beth Moore and Jane Ponder to them and their
heirs forever — 4th I have given unto my son
John Moore heretofore three hundred dollars
and he is to have no more,

5th I have heretofore given unto my son Wm Moore
three hundred dollars and he is to have no more
6th I have heretofore given to my son Benja-
min Moore three hundred dollars and he is to have
no more — 7th I have heretofore given to my
daughter Jane M. Moore three hundred
dollars and she is to have no more —
8th I do by these presents make appoint and
ordain Daniel Ponder my Executor to my
last will and testament, in witness whereof
(See over.)
