

20 Will of Judith Cowles

Know all men by these presents that I Judith
Monroe Cowles of the County and State aforesaid on the fourth
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty being weak in body and much debilitated
but of sound mind and having the favor of God before my
eyes do make this last will and testament to wit—

1st I will unto Martha Triffin wife of James Triffin
four negroes viz. Bob, Rachel, Lulu and Lavinia—
One bed Curtains bedstead & curtains and half of the bed
clothes that I own, one painted chest one large trunk
one painted slab with the furniture one painted pine
table one cooking glass one pr smoothing Irons shawl
& Tongue one spinning wheel one pr of Cards and Book
Rough my saddle one large pot one washing tub
four choice jars one large Jug & one small one & one
cow & calf called a finch

2nd I will unto Elizabeth Patillo one Negro boy
named Harry one Cow called Tab one small trunk
one large pin & chest one bed & the remaining half
of the furniture & all of the money that is belonging
to me after my just debts are paid & four jars

3rd I will unto James Patillo the lot of land that I
own in the last land Lottery

4th It is my will and desire that the remainder part
of my stock of all kinds be sold with the balance
of the Corn & fodder after taking out a years support
for James Patillo Elizabeth Wainson & Lysan Wainson
and the proceeds of said equally divided between
Mary Palmer wife of John Palmer Judith & Russ
& Eliza & Russ.

I do hereby nominate and appoint James Triffin
and William W. White Executors to this my last
will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal the day and
date above written
