M Rutherford and her children for their own proper use and benefit-
which negro woman I will shall be her part of my estate

Third- I give and bequeath unto my three sons (aforementioned) John S Woodward
Irwin H Woodward and Green S Woodward all the remainder of my Prop-
erty and effects which belong to my estate -- to be equally divided
among them.

Fourth- I will and do hereby appoint my three sons John S Woodward Irwin
H Woodward and S Woodward as Executors to this my last will and
and Testament.
