Monroe County } In the name of GOD Amen I William Wilson of the County and State aforesaid do make this my last will and testament, utterly disavowing all others by me made -

And first of all, I will that my body be buried in a decent and Christian manner on the Burial ground at my plantation.

2^d I will that all my just debts be paid out of my property -

3^d I will and bequeath unto my wife Mary Wilson all my property both real and personal during her natural life term, with the exception of four hundred dollars and a good horse which I have paid out of my estate. And at the death of my wife I will that my negro be divided off and drawn for and equally divided among my children and the balance of my estate to be paid

and my will further is that what I have given my children during my life time, (and what my wife Mary Wilson may give to them during her life time may be all rendered in at the time of the division of my estate, and be all added to the amount of my estate and be equally divided between all my children. I further will that my son Parkin Franklin Wilson be paid one thousand Dollars out of my estate over and above a child's part on account of his afflictions.

4th I will that the part or share of my estate which may be coming to my Daughters be left to them during their natural life time, and at their death to go to the heirs of their body.

5th I nominate and appoint George S Wilson, Mrs S Wilson and Simeon F Spear as my Executors to carry out my last will and testament into full force and effect 20th April in the year of our Lord 1845
