And first of all, I will that my body be buried in a decent and
Christian manner in the Burial ground at my plantation.

2d I will that all my just debts be paid out of my property -

3d I will and bequeath unto my wife Mary Wilson all my
property both real and personal during her natural life to me with
the exception of four hundred 1824-1845 \$ and a good home which
I leave to each of my children a reasonable proportion of age or money
paid out of my estate. And at the death of my wife I will
that my negro I left off ~~and drawn for and equally divided~~
be sold and the balance of my estate to be given

and my will further is that what I have given my children during my life time, and what my wife Mary Wilson may give to them during her life time may be all rendered in at the time of the division of my estate. and be all added to the amount of my estate and be equally divided between all my children. I further will that my son Larkin Franklin Wilson be paid one thousand Dollars out of my Estate over and above a child's part on account of his afflictions.

4th I will that the part or share of my estate which may be coming to my Daughters be left to them during their natural life time, and at their death to go to the heirs of their body -
5th I nominate and appoint George J Wilson, Mrs J Wilson and Simeon F Speer as my Executors to carry this my last will and testament into full force and effect 20th April in the year of our Lord 1845
