Monroe County In the name of God Amen.

I Lewis W. Durkin of the county of Chatham in (said) state being, in feeble health but of sound & disposing mind, (and) memory do make (and) ordain this my last will (and) testament.

1st In the first place, I give to my aunt Mrs Lucy Rutherford wife of Nathaniel G. Rutherford a negro boy slave named Jefferson about twelve or fourteen years of age.

2nd I give (and) bequeath to Miss Louisa M. Durkin, a negro girls slave named Felicia about ten or twelve years of age.

3rd I give (and) bequeath to Mrs Elizabeth Mercer a negro woman slave named Alice about twenty one or twenty two years of age.

4th I give (and) bequeath to Nathaniel G. Rutherford the sum of five thousand (and) twenty five dollars being, the amount for which he, as my guardian, sold a negro man slave belonging to me, also a rifle gun worth twenty five or thirty dollars (and) a double barrel gun worth about seventy five dollars - likewise, the one fourth part of the key of a lot or tract of land in Glynn county worth about fifteen hundred or two thousand dollars. These bequests I make to the (said) Nathaniel G. Rutherford for the purpose enabling him to defray all expenses whatsoever that have accrued or may hereafter accrue upon myself or out of his guardianship (and) attention to myself (and) my interests (and) if any residue remains of the property so bequeathed, to him after discharging all (said) claims & expenses. It is my will & desire that the residue so remaining should go to (and) vest in the (said) Nathaniel G. Rutherford for his own use (and) benefit.

I nominate (and) appoint John P. Parrott of the city of Savannah Executor of this my last will (and) testament.

I James Fleming being in low state of health but of sound mind and memory do hereby constitute & make this my last will and testament as follows (viz) I give unto my beloved wife Betta Fleming, all my property real and personal so long as she remains my widow or until my children become of age or marries off, and when either of the above named circumstances shall take place, I wish my wife Betta to distribute off to each of them as she may think proper of the stock, household and kitchen furniture &c. But should she marry while any of my children are minors, I will unto her only an equal share with each child of the stock, household (and kitchen furniture). I will unto my three sons Perry Lewis, Henry & James Monroe Fleming all my lands whereon I now live in the above named county (i. e.) No 226 two hundred and twenty six & part of lot No 223 two hundred and twenty three & two thirds of lot No 227 two hundred and twenty seven, all being in the seventh district of said Monroe County to be equally divided by lot to them as they become of age, reserving to my wife the house and plantation for her use (and share of the children that may still remain with her. I will unto my three daughters Zella, Elizabeth and Sarah Fleming an equal share with my wife (and sons in the following property (viz) No 224 three hundred and thirty four in the eighteenth district and third section and No 250 seven hundred and fifty in third district & fourth section both being in the gold region in the Cherokee purchase drawn in my own proper name (or if any error in the above named gold lots as to acre or sections, such lots as shall be found drawn to my or proper name) with the following negroes, a mulatto boy by the name of Frank, one woman by the name of Judy, two small girls Mearns and Mary Ann (and one young woman Melinda, the property of my wife during her widowhood.
