Georgia In the name of God Amen I Charles M. Mitchell of the
 Monroe County state and County aforesaid being in a low state of
 health, but sound in mind & memory, knowing it is
 appointed once for man to die and after death to judgment
 do hereby make & declare this to be my last will & testament
 First I give my soul to God who gave it to my body to the earth from
 whence it came to be buried in decent Christian burial, and as touching
 such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life
 It is my will & desire they should be disposed of in the manner and
 form following (viz)
 First It is my will & desire that all my household & kitchen
 furniture together with all perishable property of whatsoever kind
 should be sold at public sale or otherwise at private sale at the
 discretion of my executor also my house & lot in Calloway Street
 sold at the greatest possible advantage at either public or private
 sale by my executor and he is hereby authorized to make a good
 & legal title to the same, together with all notes bonds bills cash
 and accounts of whatsoever character - It is my will & desire that
 the money arising from such sales & sources after paying my just
 debts & funeral expenses, should be kept out at interest
 for the use of my Grand daughter Mary Ann Margaret daughter of Emily
 Dennis for during her natural life and at her death to the heirs of her body
 But should said Mary Ann Margaret be dead before she arrives at
 the age of twenty or marry then it is my will & desire that all
 my estate should be equally divided share & share

alike between the sons of David Dennis and his wife Mary Dennis
to the entire exclusion of Sarah Dennis

Second I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty friends Jas Decker
& Jas Decker my executors to this my last will & testament hereby
reversing & setting aside all former wills & executors by me at any
time previously made In testimony of which I hereunto set my hand &
seal This 3^d of March 1839
