Monroe County I Mary Wallace of the State and County aforesaid being
in a low state of health but sound in mind and memory do hereby make
and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other
wills Testaments or bequests by me previously made
Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my son Rich^d Wallace one half of my
stock of horses and all my stock of sheep and I leave unto him all my
interest that is our half of negro man Hampton and at his death to be
disposed of as hereafter pointed out & give his seven turnbells
Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my nephew John L Woodard one
saddle bed, bedstead and furniture and my negro woman Polly one dozen
earthen plates, 2 dishes and 3 bed quilts, & 2 1/2 counterpane on set cups and saucers
and one bowl and my large red chest and one ^{white} pitcher this to be his share in
full of my estate, Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my niece Elizabeth
Barber one feather bed, bedstead and furniture three bed quilts three blue
counterpane and two white ones and one blue bowl on dozen earthen plates
and my large trunk and one white pitcher on 1/2 crown & 1/2 tumbler and seven
plain tumblers this to be her share of my estate in full, Item 4th I give
and bequeath unto my sister Agiah Woodard three children, Sarah Becket
Gavin Woodard and Orren Woodard my brother Balaam Wallace six
children Nancy Miller her widow last child is excepted and excluded from
any participation in my estate my brother William Wallace two children Nancy
Miller and ^{John} Wallace my sister Hannah Menyard two children Ethel
Menyard and John Menyard all my estate both real and personal
including Hampton at death the death that is not disposed of
above, share and share alike. It is my will that all my property should
be sold and equally divided between my nephews and nieces as men-
tioned in this fourth item and it is further my will and desire that
my brother Edward Wallace Thomas Maupole William Roris and
David Koff should have three shillings each which is only left
them to exclude them entirely with all others who may set up
a claim from any participation in my estate, I do hereby
Constitute and John L Woodard and James S. Lester my executors
to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former
wills and Executors by me made publishing and declaring
this and more other to be my last will and Testaments
Signed sealed and published as and declared
in the presence of us and we appeared in the
presence of each other this twenty eight day of
November Eighteen hundred and thirty three

death do make ordains constitute and appoint this to be my last will and

- Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my son Simon Durham ~~five~~ dollars
besides what I have given,
- Item 2nd My will and desire is that after my death my executors hereafter
named exchange the negro Washington for the negro Tom now in the
possession of my son Sherman Durham which negro Tom I hereby give
and bequeath unto the children of my son Simon Durham and
that said negro Tom be placed in the charge of my son Simon (or
right of his children) on his giving his receipt for the same to help
support and school them till the spring next arrives to the age of
thirteen years and then to be equally divided amongst his children
- Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Pleasant fifty dollars
besides her equal share of the residue legacy as mentioned in the
bequests item of this will
- Item 4th My will and desire is that the negro Jacob and Amy be sold
or appraised by five freeholders and that my Singleton take the negro
Amy at the aforesaid valuation and be accountable to my estate for
that amount and that my son Sherman take Jacob in the same
manner at the valuation and be accountable to my estate for that
amount for a that both the same money for said two negroes to be
payable the same time as the money arising from the sale of
my property as directed to be sold by my executors on a credit
