I Nancy Brantley of the county and state aforesaid being in low
health but at the same time being altogether of a sound and rational
mind and furthermore being apprised of the great uncertainty of life
and the certainty of death do now in their presence make this my last
will and testament in manner and form following

And the first place of my will is that I give and bequeath unto the hands of
almighty God the authors of them

In the next place after the payment of all my just debts
I bequeath unto my friend and neighbor William B. Hill the sum of
one hundred dollars as a testimony of respect and gratitude for his
friendly attention to me while in my bodily affliction

And the next place of my will is that I give and bequeath unto my father
situate together with my mother and myself at that I may not
now be apprised of to be equally divided into three equal
parts and the part I bequeath unto my mother Lucy Brantley

another part I bequeath unto my sister Frances Gibson and the other remain-
 ing part I bequeath unto the children of my sister Louisa Carter - I wish
 the children to receive their equal portions as they severally reach the age of
 twenty or years; but should any or all of them die minors, then my desire is
 that all their interest shall, instead of passing into the hands of Washington
 Carter my brother in law, be held in trust by Major Mantley and Churchill
 Gibson for the use and benefit of my sister Louisa Carter during her natural
 life, and at her death to be equally divided between my next nearest relations
 and that I may be plainly understood my desire is that in case one
 of the above named Trustees should die before this will is carried fully into effect
 then and in that event the survivors will act alone, but should both die, then in
 order to secure the property bequeathed unto the children of my sister Louisa
 from the care or misbehaving of my brother in law G. W. Carter, my desire is
 that the court will appoint a suitable person to hold said property in trust
 to be disposed of as above required.

Lastly, I appoint and desire that Benge Mantley and Churchill Gibson
 execute this, my last will and testament.
