Monroe Cty } Ann Woodard of the County and
State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory
taking into view the mortality of the body do make
a last will and testament as follows
Item I wish all my property to remain together as if I were alive in the
hands of my beloved wife, during her widowhood a life.

2^d If she should think proper to marry then let the property be equally
divided between herself and the children.

3^d I wish the youngest children schooled a year enough to school them
equal to the two oldest before the division.

4th If my wife should die and not many such of the property
as she can best spare, by getting an order of Court to have
such property valued and filed in the office, that ultimately
an equal division of my estate may be made between my
children.

5th As my family will remove from this to Monroe Cty I wish
the negroes to be swapped, sold or bought, to accommodate
husb funds or wives, so far as the executor & executrix may
think proper as can be just to the estate.

6th My last wish is that Bizziah Woodard and Arben
Rodgers should be the executor and executrix of this my
last will and testament signed sealed and delivered
in presence of
