but informs on body do make and declare this to be
my last will and testament.
First - For the love good will and affection I have for
my wife Sophia Milner do give the land whereon I now
live lying east of the road marked by the State lands
with as much of the household and kitchen furniture
as she may choose to keep if it should be all with
as many of the Hogs cattle and sheep as she may so
like to keep, and three of the horses that she may choose
to take of my stock and my Bannocks and as much of
the provisions and provisions as she may choose to keep
I also give to my wife the following negroes, viz Thomas
Lucy Sam, Lucinda, Phoebe, Jane, Fannie, Rachael, Eliza
Betty and Eady, all the above negroes to be kept during his
natural life time, and at his death or at any other time, the
house hold property and the negro girls Fannie and
Eady may be disposed of as she may think proper.
And my wish is that all my negroes except the above
named negroes given to my wife to be kept

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divided between my son John H. Milnes Elizabeth Sims
my son Pitt Milnes and my grand children Pitt Calla-
way Madison Callaway John H. Callaway Benito Head
Apsela Callaway and Sanford Callaway the last named grand
children only to have one share equal to those of my children
John H. Milnes Pitt Milnes and Elizabeth Sims—
3rd. I give and bequeath to my daughter Pendope Carson
five hundred dollar in addition to what she has already
received.

4th I also give and bequeath to my daughter Susan John
son five hundred dollar in addition to what she has
already received.

5th I also give to my grand daughters Nancy E. Gauman
and Mary E. Gauman five hundred dollar each in addi-
tion to what they have already received.

All of the above named bequeaths of money to be paid
one half as soon as may be thought by my executors pro-
fitable after my death, and the other half after the
death of my wife.

6th My will and desire is that the remainder of the
negroes that I have willed to my wife with the exception
of Harriet and Lady to be equally divided, between my
son John H. Milnes, Elizabeth Sims, Pitt Milnes and my six grand
children Pitt Callaway Madison Callaway Benito Head
Apsela Callaway, John H. Callaway and Sanford Calla-
way the six last mentioned grand children to have one
share equal to my son John H. Milnes Pitt Milnes and
Elizabeth Sims at the death of my wife.

7th My will and desire, also is that the whole of my
estate both real and personal not herein before ~~mentioned~~
and should there be any left after paying the above named
bequeaths— the remainder to be equally divided
between my son John H. Milnes, my daughter Elizabeth
Sims and my son Pitt Milnes.

8th And lastly I appoint my sons John H. Milnes and
Pitt H. Milnes executors to this my last will and testa-
