 Monroe County } self weak in Body but of sound mind and
 memory, I make this my last will and testament, nothing
 at other form or wills. In the first place I Richard Hamlin
 will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it, and my body
 to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my
 Executors, In the next place I will and bequeath to my
 son John Hamlin One hundred and one fourth acres and
 one fourth acres of my lands of the square No 5 lying
 in the Eleventh district of Baldwin now Jones County
 and granted to myself lying on the North side of the
 Branch and if that lacks quantity, as much off the
 South Corner as will make up said quantity, my next
 desire is that all the rest of my estate real and per-
 sonal do belong to my beloved wife Mary Hamlin
 during her natural life for her maintenance and sup-
 port, and after both our deaths I will and bequeath
 to my son John Hamlin my Negro Fellow, Peter, I
 also will and bequeath to my son Gaudson Richard
 Hamlin for the remainder of my lot of land No 10 as
 aforesaid, together with a Negro boy named Kinchen —
 I also will and bequeath to my son John Hamlin
 One Negro Girl by the name of Easter, I also will
 and bequeath to my daughter Betty Hamlin now

Bevery And given. Two Dollars to be paid out of
 my Estate by my Executors within six months after the
 death of myself and wife — all the rest of my goods
 Chattle and Tenements in the house and out of doors to be
 divided into three parts, two parts to belong to my son John
 and one part to my grandson Richard, after paying
 all my just debts, my wife wearing clothes excepted
 They to be at her disposal as she thinks proper — It is
 also my next desire that my son John Hamlin and
 Adam Carson should act as the Executors of this my
 last will and testament.
