being sick, the very old and advanced in years and
 knowing that it is appointed unto man once to die, and that my
 time on earth cannot be long, I have therefore thought fit to
 make and ordain this my last will and testament in the
 form and manner following:

"First - I commit my soul into his holy and safe keeping who
 made it - His body - my body to be buried in
 decent Christian burial."

"Thirdly - To my dear daughter Sarah

"Fourthly - I give to every of my children who have never had
 a feather bed from me twenty five dollars each

"Fifthly - I give to my beloved person Molly her freedom
 to be under the special guardianship of my son Thomas

"Sixthly - As to the income of this world's goods which
 with I have had and now possess or may possess at the time
 of my decease - I make the following distribution (viz)

To Joseph, John, James, Robert, Thomas, Washington, Isaac,
 William, Mary, Sarah, Mose, and Abner and
 Josiah each an equal and distributive share of the same

"Seventhly - In order that this my last will and testa-
 ment be faithfully executed I do hereby constitute and
 appoint my two sons Thomas and William McJinty my
 executors with the right to dispose of all my estate in the
 way they may deem most prudent for the benefit of each
 and all of my children equally
