the State of Georgia and County of Monroe being of sound
mind and memory thanks be to God for the same, feeling
the uncertainty of this life, do make this my last will and
testament in manner following. I recommend my soul to
the Creator looking for a joyful resurrection through the
blesed redemption my body to be given to the earth in a
decent Christian burial. 1st all my just debt to be paid
and I give to my brother Samuel \$1000 five hundred
dollars. 2. I give to my brother William \$1000 five hundred
dollars. 3. I give to my brother George A. Wynn all the balance of
my property. 4. My last request is that Messrs Samuel
attends to my estate as Executor.

Being very sick though
in perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the
mortality of my body and well knowing that it is now
appointed for me to die do make this my last will
and testament - first I recommend my soul into
the hands of him who gave it - I desire my body
to be buried in a decent Christian burial This is
my just debt to be paid out of my property after
my decease - To my beloved wife Martha Partridge
I give and bequeath as follows viz one negro girl
named Elender about twelve years old to be her share
during her natural life or widowhood but not so as to be
subject for her to see her mother to be liable to be sold for
any debt she may hereafter contract And in case my
wife should marry then the above named girl to
be the ^{property} ~~wife~~ of my children and if she should not
marry at her death the above named slave and her
increase if any then be is to be equally divided amongst
all my heirs - And as to the balance of my property
I wish it equally divided among all my children and
such as may be heirs at law in place of my own
children that is to say when my children are dead I
wish their children to draw in their place and such
part to be their own right as heirs and not otherwise
And my wife to be an equal sharer in all my property
with my children. Given under my hand and seal this
eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred and thirty three
