 Monroe County } by these presents that I Theophilus Gordon of the
 State and County aforesaid being sick and in low condition
 but blessed be God of Grace and disposing Memory and call-
 -ing to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die
 do give the first place Commit my soul to God that gave
 it and I trust has redeemed it, and my body to be laid in
 the grave at the discretion of my executors and being possessor
 of sundry worldly goods do leave and dispose of them in
 the following manner viz. To my beloved brother Josiah G. Gordon
 and Matthew G. Gordon I leave and bequeath a certain negro
 man &c my horse and saddle two beds and furniture
 trunks and wearing apparel and fifty dollars in money
 to be equally divided between them in such manner as they
 may jointly agree on they settling all just demands or debts
 against me. Once lately for carrying this my last will
 and testament into full effect hoping all others to be arranged
 and appoint my two brothers Josiah G. and Matthew G. Gordon
 executors of this will. Given under my hand and seal this
 25th of February in the year of our Lord 1830-

Georgia } Aaron Gordon came into open Court and made oath that he was the Substantive
 Monroe County } Witness to the within will and that he saw Ebenezer Botwell sign the
 same as a witness and that he saw Theophilus Gordon read & sign Seal and publish
 the same to be his last will and testament and at the time of doing so he believed
 him to be in sound mind and Memory Given to in open Court the 3rd of
 March 1830.
