and publish this my last will and testament.

1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Matilda
Black my carriage and horses for as long as she also my desire
that she have the use during her natural life of my Sofa
and book case and after her death I desire that said
Sofa and bookcase be given to my beloved son Robert
to Black the reason should probably be here given why the
above mentioned items are all that I give my beloved wife
it is that before our marriage there was a written agreement
entered into between myself and my now wife giving to
her the sole disposal of Forty five thousand dollars after
my death.

Item 2nd It is my desire the rest and residue of my property
both real and personal be valued and equally divided be-
tween my beloved sons William A Black, Robert C Black
and my beloved daughter Susan Martin with the exception
of my mahogany bedstead, his signature and my blue
table spoons which I desire may be given to my son
Robert C Black.

Item 3rd It is my wish and desire that my old negroes
Peter and Dinah may be retained and one of my sons
William A or Robert C take them both and take care of
them during their lives for the faithful services they have
rendered to my Parents and to myself.

Item 4th I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved sons
William A Black and Robert C Black my executors, re-
quiring them to see that these my last intentions are carried
into execution.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this the fifth day of February eighteen
Hundred and thirty nine hereby revoking all former wills
made by me.
