I William Lhanerly being in sound mind and memory and it is ordered that all men shall do so make this my last will and testament.

1st I recommend my soul to god and that my body be decently buried

2nd I will that all my just debts be paid by my executor in

3rd I will to my beloved wife Mary Lhanerly the following property to wit during her life time or widowhood viz the plantation where I now live on with all the personal property by them and four negro women viz Harriet Sally Dolly & Abby.

4th I will that my son William Lhanerly shall have one negro boy by the name of David and one bed and furniture and that my daughter Sarah Lhanerly shall have one negro girl by the name of Abby and one bed and furniture. And that my daughter Elizabeth Allen shall have one negro girl by the name of Phyllis and that my daughter Nancy Allen shall have one slave and that her son William Lhanerly shall have a negro girl by the name of Rachel and one bed and furniture and if said Nancy should ever have any more children then for them to come in and share equally with said William and that my daughter Harriet Allen shall have one negro girl by the name of Fanny and twenty five dollars in cash and that my daughter Harriet shall have one negro girl by the name of Mary and twenty dollars in cash and that my son William Lhanerly shall have two negroes Abby & girl

Marshall a boy, and one bay Horse one bed and furniture
5th I will that a certain negro woman by the name
of Mary be sold to help pay my debts.

6th I have left to my beloved wife Mary Lehanely at
her death then said property to be equally divided be-
tween six of my children and one grand child namely
William, Sarah, Elizabeth, Marion Harriet Gilman and
my grand son William all to share equally except in
the land and house and mules & cows then I will to my
two sons William Lehanely and Gilman Lehanely.

7th I do constitute and appoint my wife Mary Lehan-
ely my executrix to said will.
