Monroe County, I William Fambrough of the county & state above named being in a bad state of health but of a sound disposing mind viewing the uncertainty of life and wishing to arrange my temporal affairs before my departure from this world. I therefore in the first place commit my soul unto God who gave it to be disposed of according to His wisdom and my body to the earth to be decently interred by my executors & friends. In the disposition of my property I make the following bequests:

- First I bequeath unto my wife Theobald Fambrough our bed and furniture our desk, our chest and one thousand dollars to be paid over to her by my executors as soon as the money can be collected from the sale of my property. The above specified amount shall be for her support during life & at her death, if there should be any part of said sum remaining, it shall be equally divided among my children. The above shall constitute her part of my estate in full.
- Second - I bequeath unto my son Robert Fambrough one hundred dollars which shall constitute his part of my estate (with what has already been given him by me) in full.
- Third I bequeath unto my daughter Nettie Sarah Single the wife of Solomon J Single one hundred dollars with what has already been given which shall constitute his part of my estate in full.
- Fourth I bequeath unto my son William L Fambrough two hundred dollars with what has already been given which shall constitute his part of my estate in full.
- Fifth In like manner I bequeath unto my son Allen Fambrough six hundred dollars with what has already been given which shall constitute his part of my estate in full. (Say all the residue of the above mentioned bequests after the sale of my property shall be equally divided among them of my children)
- Sixth. I also request as soon after my death as shall be thought most expedient by my executors, I desire that all of my estate both personal & real shall be sold & distributed according to the above mentioned bequests.
- Seventh In like manner I request my three sons Robert, William & Allen Fambrough to act as executors of this my last will and testament. The annexed will & testament signed sealed and delivered in presence of us this 5th day of November A.D. 1836

 certainty of death do ordain constitute and appoint this my last will and
 testament after recommending my soul to God & my body to the dust
 from whence it came & dispose of what worldly goods it hath pleased God
 to bestow on me in the following manner viz.
 I in the first place give unto my beloved wife Nancy Kiddle, wife
 the lot of land wherein I now live it being situate in the 5th district
 of Monroe county including all my buildings and arendly five acres part
 of lots nos 34 and 78 in said county my district during her natural life
 and then to be equally divided between my three youngest children Albert
 William Jackson and Eliza Anne Kiddle to each them equal
 with my eldest children as regards land and also four negroes viz. Ling
 Arnold Sarah and Odious two horses two cows & calves & twenty five head
 of stock keep all of her own choosing all the household and kitchen
 furniture and an equal share of all the steady money that may come in
 hand at any deced. all of which property is to be sold at her death
 and the money equally divided among all of my heirs except the
 land above mentioned
