I William Hanson of the State of Georgia and County of Monroe, considering myself to be fast on the decline of life, though in perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it is once appointed that all men should die, and as touching such things wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with, do give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form (to wit). First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the ground to be buried in a Christian like manner by my Executor hereafter named. Secondly I do make and ordain my loving son Enoch Hanson my lawful Executor Revoking all other. It is my desire that my Executor pay all legal debts, it is my desire that my loving wife Ann should keep all of my property during her life, or widowhood, and at the expiration of either all of my property to be sold to the best advantage, and equally divided between the lawful begotten heirs of my body and my grand son William Martin, and if William Martin should be unborn his part to be equally divided among the rest of my lawful heirs. It is my desire that the part of my estate that should be coming to my daughter Betsey Ann Miller should be equally divided among the lawful begotten heirs of her body.
