household and kitchen furniture for and during her natural  
life and at her death to my wish and desire that the

named George I give and bequeath to my youngest son  
William P Pool —

I owe to my eldest son Robert L. Pool I give and  
bequeath a yellow girl named Fannie under her two children.  
Isabella and Mary —

I owe to my son Ephraim P. Pool our negro boy named Joe  
I owe to my son Seth Pool I give and bequeath a black boy  
named Anthony also to my will. When the division of the  
with property takes place that the rest of my heirs herein  
named may purchase a home worth twenty dollars for my  
son Seth of above named —

I owe to my son Thomas A. Pool I give and bequeath a  
negro boy named Daniel and also my heirs as above and  
to this named may purchase a home for my son Thomas  
Pool worth twenty dollars —

I owe to my Daughter Charlotte Pool I give and bequeath  
one negro boy named Joe here —

I owe to my Daughter Martha Pool I give and bequeath one  
negro boy named Arthur —

to my son William Pool I give and bequeath two  
negro girls one named Amaly the other giddy and lastly  
I do you make now appoint my sons Robert L. Pool and  
Ephraim Pool sole Executors of this my last will and testament  
and by all other former wills her by who made his writings which  
I have hereunto set my name and date this 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1828

I William Miller of the County of Monroe and State of Georgia  
being at this time & place in body but of sound & perfect mind  
do hereby make & convey that it is once & forever my Will & desire  
to die & leave property to no other and no trustee shall have  
my testament after remanaging my effects & goods  
of all kinds & my body to be buried at the discretion of  
my family friends proceed to make the following distribution  
of my worldly estate which it has pleased you to bestow  
upon me in the manner & form following:

First — It is my wish and desire that my estate both real  
and personal should be kept together & remain a legacy  
of all the discretion of my executors hereafter to be divided  
under my express directions shall arrive to the age of  
twenty one years or the marriage of my wife  
according to her & his own discretion who are now of full age  
to whom there is no distribution share of my personal  
property at this time my wife being considered as entitled  
to a principal division to the neglect of his share  
common with my children and my other children to  
divide the between us as they arrive to the age of twenty  
one years or if a daughter she may draw on this account  
herefore it is moreover provided that in the event of  
the intermarriage of my wife before my youngest child  
shall arrive to the age of twenty one years it is my will  
and desire that as well as all other division of the  
whole of my estate shall then take place to lump all my  
children who from me before whom there share of the  
personal property being my wife antiquated article  
which shall be common to my whole estate with my
