I leave to my son E. Prmain F. Poole one negro boy named Joe

I leave to my son Edith Poole I give and bequeath a black boy
named Anthony also to my will. when the division of the
with property takes place that the rest of my heirs herein
named may purchase a home worth twenty dollars for my
son Edith of above named—

I leave to my son Thomas F. Poole I give and bequeath a
negro boy named Daniel and also my heirs as above and
within named may purchase a home for my son Thomas
F. Poole worth twenty dollars—

I leave to my Daughter Charlotte Poole I give and bequeath
one negro boy named Joe hue—

I leave to my Daughter Martha Poole I give and bequeath one
negro boy named Arthur—

I leave to my son William Poole I give and bequeath two
negro girls one named Anahy the other Ginny and lastly
the above named appoint my sons Robert C. Poole and
E. Prmain Poole as Executors This my last will and testament
revoking all other former wills her by me made in writing whith
I have hereunto set my name and date this 15th of March 1828

according to the order of my executor whom I have appointed
to draw the equal distributive share of my personal
property at that time my wife being considered as entitled
to a equal division to the equal distributive share
common with my children and my other children to
draw in like manner as they arrive to the age of twenty
one years or if a daughter she may draw on that account
before it is necessary provided that in the event of
the first marriage of my wife before my youngest child
shall arrive to the age of twenty one years it is my wish
and desire that a general and equal division of the
whole of my estate shall then take place to turn all my
children who have not before arrived there share of the
personal property of my wife and equal distributive
share in common in my whole estate with my
