I William Ingleon being of sound
mind but of infirm body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men
to die do hereby make this my last will and testament.
First. It is my will and desire that my wife Elizabeth Ingleon and
my two daughters Nancy Cannon and Adeline Ingleon should have the
1st of land of one hundred acres more or less on which I now live
it being the west half of said lot in common during their natural
lives and at the death of my wife Elizabeth Ingleon to be equally
divided between Nancy Cannon & Adeline Ingleon I wish them to be
divided between Robt. Wm. Cannon, Lewis Cannon, Mary E. Cannon and
Emerson P. Ingleon. It is my will and desire
that my wife have all my house hold and personal property with all

64 my stock during her natural life then to be equally divided between Nancy Cannon and Adeline Snelson. I have two draws in the gold lottery and if I should draw any thing it is my will and desire that it be in common with my wife Nancy Cannon and Adeline Snelson & at their death to be divided between their children Robt. E. Cannon, Lewis M. Cannon and Mary E. Cannon & Cherson P. Snelson & for in this I am sure they may choose to sell it.

4th It is my desire that William A. Wheeler be executor of this my last will and testament.
