I William Midden of the County of Monroe and State of Georgia
being at this time weak in body but of sound mind and memory
and knowing that it is my duty to make a will I do hereby make
to die do think proper to make and to give this my last
will & Testament after recommending my soul to god
and I my body to the earth to be buried in the presence of
my family & friends proceed to make the following disposition
of my worldly estate which it has pleased god to bless me
with in the manner & form following:
I Give & It is my wish and desire that my estate both real
and personal should be kept together and managed by
I or the discretion of my executor hereafter to be named
until my youngest child shall arrive to the age of
twenty one years or the first marriage of my wife's
surviving my son & children whom I have of late years
to draw there equal distributive share of my personal
property at that time my wife being considered as entitled
and a proper division to an equal distributive share
common with my children and my other children to
draw in like manner as they arrive to the age of twenty
one years or if a daughter she may draw on that inheritance
before it is divided provided that in the event of
the intermarriage of my wife before my youngest child
shall arrive to the age of twenty one years it is my wish
and desire that a mutual and equal division of the
whole of my estate shall take place to be kept as my
children who shall have been drawn there share of the
personal property allowing my wife consequent distrib-
utive share in common in my whole estate with my

children and those of my children who may have already drawn
their share of my personal property shall share in common
with my wife and the balance of my children in the division
of my real estate but if no such partition should take
place before my youngest child shall arrive to the age of
twenty one years then said division to take place as before
stated with the exception of one lot of land by me in
County drawn by me, which I wish should be sold, and
the proceeds equally divided between my wife and children
in the manner above pointed out for the division of my
personal property

Then I do hereby nominate and appoint my son
Barth Wilder and my son in law John Wilder
executors of this my last will and testament.
