David Smith were present Sat-
urday the twenty first of Septem-
ber in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and
fifty at the residence of Mr Arch-
ibald Smith long man before
and at the time of his death in
perfect possession of his mental
faculties. He called upon us to
remember and take notice of what
he was about to say and stated
as follows I have nothing worth
dividing among you all and
as David has come home I want
him to stay at home and take
care of Mother and tend to her
business and pay what is com-
owing and I want George to tend
to my Owoon law suit and be
paid well for this trouble and
if he loses the case there is
here David will advance to
pay the case I believe Mother has
done the best she could to raise
us up in the fear of the Lord
and I want her to have
all the rest of my estate
Shortly after he breathed his
last September the 27th 1852
