 of God Amen I Lucretia Phillips of the County
 and State aforesaid being depressed with
 the thought of the uncertainty of death
 and knowing that I have shortly to go the
 way of all the earth as it is appointed
 for all our race to die my wish is to
 have my remains in the following
 manner in the first place I give leave
 to almighty God who gave it and then
 my other property in the following manner
 after my debts are paid of them be any
 I give & bequeath to my dear beloved daughter
 in Law Nancy Phillips the wife of Will-
 iam C Phillips late of said State and
 County aforesaid deceased two certain
 Negroes named Rachel and Anne and the
 child I have and bequeath unto my
 Grand son Patrick Phillips a Negro Woman
 named Soley and her increase and also
 the plantation & land belonging to the same
 a house I know reside unto the next
 place I give & bequeath unto my grand
 son Anthony Phillips one Negro Girl Name
 Lane and her increase & the next
 place I give and bequeath unto my grand
 son John Phillips a Negro Boy Ezekiel also
 at my death should have a horse or
 more I leave to the said John Phillips the
 balance of my property of stock & Negroes
 household furniture leave with my Grand
 son to divide equally between his two
 sisters Mary and Eliza Phillips now

married I appoint my well beloved Grandson
Wm Phillips my Executor of this my last
will and Testament and I do revoke all
wills by me heretofore made and do by these
presents acknowledge this my last will and
Testament Signed Sealed and delivered this
15th day of June 1840 in presence of
Clement Mosley }

as a witness also sworn to and sub-
scribed before me this 21st day of Janu-
ary 1840
