this world that it has pleased God to bless
with I wish to dispose of in the following
manner that is to say first of all I wish all
Just debts to be paid by my Executors
after to be named

I Give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy
Mittell Mitchell Widow of William Mitchell of Georgia
my Estate both Real and personal & except as
hereafter Excepted to her and her heirs forever

I Give and bequeath to my nephew Henry
Carleton Cox the Sum of five hundred dollars

I Give to my nephew Henry Carleton the Sum
of five hundred dollars

I Give to my nephew Thomas Carleton the
Sum of two hundred dollars the above named

Sum of money to be paid to them and to their heirs to be paid
by my Executors as soon as they can with Convenience

5th I Give to my little Grand Children to wit
my Cox Mitchell & William Henry Mitchell two
hundred two and one half Acres of Land known

as the fifth district of formerly Baldwin County
now Morgan aforesaid by lot Number Sixty two
in the last of the Division of the County of

Now the 6th I Give and bequeath to my little Grand Son
William Henry Mitchell My Shot Gun and
Silver bullets

Now the 7th It is my will and desire that my Negroes Begeth
her Chisum Harriet Maria Pleasant & Eliza with
her freedom increase with the boy Washington
my daughter Mary E Mitchell and her husband
only to her and then dispose of

Now the 8th I hereby appoint my daughter Mary
Clark Mitchell Executrix to this my last Will
testament and James Gillespie Executor
and annulling all former Will by me made
Signed sealed and proclaimed Henry Carden
in presence of us this 8th day
of October 1844
