

Last Will and Testament of Edmond Walker,
 State of Georgia, In the name of my Heavenly Father, the having
 Morgan County, blessed me with the good things of this life, and
 a Spirit to praise him in all things, I make this my last will and
 Testament. Item 1st. It is my will and desire that my burial
 and medical expenses be paid first; and then all my just debts
 and liabilities next. Item 2nd. It is my will and desire to
 provide for the maintenance of my wife Mary Elizabeth Wal-
 ker and her two children by me, Elizabeth Mary Walker and
 Peter Cantien Walker, first, I leave them my plantation on
 Little River, to my wife Mary Elizabeth Walker and her two chil-
 dren by me, Elizabeth Mary Walker and Peter Cantien Walker
 in joint stock to be managed by my Executor or Executors for
 their support and maintenance; I also, give to my wife Mary
 E. Walker, and her two children by me, Elizabeth M. Walker and
 Peter E. Walker, One hundred and Thirty two (132) Shares of
 Georgia Rail Road Stock, not to be sold or disposed of, but to
 be kept in joint stock, the Annual Dividends of which, togeth-
 er with all the supplies made on the plantation are to be equal-
 ly divided between my wife Mary, E. Elizabeth, M. & Peter
 E. Walker, so long as the aforesaid Mary, E. Walker lives, or remains

W. Walker, as long as the afore said Mary, C. Walker lives, or remains my widow, if she marries again, her interest in the above named property returns to her two Children, Elizabeth M. & Peter G. Walker. If said Elizabeth M. & Peter G. Walker, should die without lawful heirs, I desire everything to remain the same during my wife's natural life or widow hood; but if either, or both the afore said Children, Elizabeth M. or Peter G. should out-live my wife, Mary, C. they inherit the afore said property in fee simple; but should they both die without heirs, then it returns to my estate, to be divided between Leonard C. Walker, Arthur Newton and Richard Denton. I give my wife Mary, C. Elizabeth M. and Peter G. Walker, six choice mules and three choice horses, I leave Fanny Moore and her colt as cold to them in fee simple, also nine good milk cows & calves, one good Yoke of Oxen, and the Ox Cart, all the flock of Sheep and Hogs until Peter G. is twenty one years of age, ~~some~~ Road Wagon and Horness, and the small Wagon & Horness Peter made, to be his own; Also the Buggy and Horness, the Spring Wagon & Horness, The Big Mule, and Ox Wagon & ~~Accessments~~, Item, I ~~give~~ to Bessie, or Elizabeth M., I give the house & Lots in the City of Madison, with every thing on them, just as they stand, also Thirty four (34) acres of Wood Land bought of Joseph Bosow, near Madison; When the said Peter

I. be comes. Twenty one (21) years of age, Elizabeth M. Comes into possession of her share of the lands, as follows: My Peyton Jones Lot (no. 211) All of the Harrison Jones Lot (no 239) of which I am in possession; that part of the Mooney Lot (no. 212) lying on the left of the Road to the Swamp, as the road now runs. It is also my desire that my wife, Mary E. Walker, have a home with the said Elizabeth M., in Madison, or with the said Peter, S. Walker at his plantation, as the said Mary E. may choose, and that Elizabeth M. and Peter S. Walker be bound for her support as long as she may remain my widow. The Fielder Lot (no 240) I sold to Zebulon Walker; the notes of Zebulon Walker to go to Elizabeth M. as a portion of her part of the estate and in place of the land which I sold to Zebulon Walker, which otherwise would have been her part. Item 4th. On a division I give to Peter, S. Walker, the following Property, My Homestead on Little River including such household and Kitchen furniture as he may need, the surplus to be sold. The Laefler Phan Lot, (no. 213,) The whole of the Jackson Lot now in my possession (no. 214) The whole of the Halley Lot (no. 238) All of the Carmichael Lot of which I am possessed. Also that part of the ...

of the Swamp Pasture, giving from the Rock Corner of Lots, Nos.
 212, 213, 238 & 239. Along the fence which now encloses the Pasture,
 to the Peyton Jones Line, also, all of the mooney lying on the left
 hand side of the Swamp Pasture Road, including the road, and
 also, the piece of Woods known as the Clarke's woods, I give to
 him my Silver Watch, my Long Shot Gun, The Corn Sheller, the
 new Crescent Saw, the Blacksmiths & Carpenters Tools, One
 half of the Cotton Gin I give jointly to Mary E. Elizabeth, M.,
 & Peter E. Walker. The negroes own the other half and have
 their notes for it. Item, & Item. It is my desire that after
 all my debts are paid, that the remainder of my estate not-
 previously mentioned, including all surplus stuff be
 sold, and the proceeds to be equally divided between Leander
 A. Walker, M., ^{son of} Keturah Hewitson and Richard Denton, Esq.,
 who has received his share of my estate, and I shall make no
 more provision for him, or my Grand Daughter, Letitia
 Battle, as they are both dead. Zebulon Walker, has received
 more for his part of my property, than any of my children,
 therefore I make no other provision for him, than I have
 already made. I give to ^{son of} Keturah Hewitson, The Clarke's
 Old Place on the other side of the river from my house.

I also desire her to have one share of Ea. Rail Road Stock.
I desire that my collection of Books be equally and mutually
divided with all my children, and not sold.
It is my will that all money in the hands of my Commission Mer-
chants or Ea. Rail Road Company, be equally divided between
my wife and her two children, Elizabeth M. & Peter L. Wal-
ker, Item, ^{7th} In consideration of the marriage articles
between the former Mary, E. Horley, now my wife, and myself
Edmond Walker, I do hereby say, it was not to dispossess her
of any interest in my estate, but to guard against any
debts that might come against my estate, from her own
debts, or those of her former husbands.
I do hereby appoint ^{last} Mrs. H. Newton & Peter Sautier Walker, my
lawful Executors to this my last Will and Testament, Revo-
king all other Wills I have made, also removing all disabi-
lities in Peter Sautier Walker's minority, making him eli-
gible, as though he was twenty one years of age.

Lord, One Thousand Eight hundred and Seventy eight -
