Georgia In the name of God
Morgan County Amen I Peter Snellings
of the state and County of Morgan being weak &
feeble in body but of sound and disposing memory
do make and decree this my last will and testament
in manner and form following (Viz),
I do give and bequeath unto my beloved
Mother Sally Snellings Widow of Alexander
Snellings late of the state of Virginia and County
of Chesterfield the sum of fifty dollars and
also a parcel of plank which I have now on
the plantation whereon she resides which said
plank is to be applied to the use of repairing or
building on said plantation at her discretion
I also bequeath unto my Mother one feather bed
now in the state of Virginia left me by my
father for and during her natural life and
at her death I give the said bed & furniture
to my nephew Benjamin Saprade his heirs &
assigns forever Also to my Will & desire that
my Mother as aforesaid remain in the peaceful
possession & enjoyment of the Land and

25 Premises Wherupon she now lives & is interupt
so long as she lives — Item I give and bequeath
unto my brother John Snelling all the property
which I have or hold in the State of Georgia
after paying my first debts —

Item I give and bequeath unto my brother George
Snelling all my books which are in Virginia —

Item I give and bequeath unto my Sister Sally
Laprade after or at the death of my mother
one negro man called old bob and also one
fourteenth part of the proceeds of the Land &
Premises Wherupon my mother now lives to her
my said Sister Sally Laprade her heirs and assigns
forever — Item I give and bequeath all the
balance of the proceeds of said Land after
deducting the aforesaid fourteenth part thereof
for Sister Sally Laprade to be equally divided
amongst all the Rest of my Brothers & Sisters
except my brother Alexander Snelling John
Snelling George Snelling William Snelling
Manny Brooks Moller Elam & Elizabeth Snelling
to them their heirs and assigns forever —

Item I give and bequeath all the money
Bonds Notes & accounts which is my first Right
in the Estate of my father or otherwise in the
State of Virginia to be equally divided between
all my Brothers & Sisters except my brother
John Snelling (say George Snelling) Alexander
Snelling William Snelling Manny Brooks Molly
Elam Sally Laprade & Elizabeth Snelling
to them their heirs and assigns forever —

Lastly I hereby appoint Cornelius and

Oraicin My brother John Snelling and my
Brother William Snelling, sole Executors in my
last will and testament hereby making
null & void all former Wills by me before
made or made & attesting and confirming
this & this only in testimony whereof I hereunto set
my hand & affix my seal this 23th day of March
in the year of our Lords one thousand eight
hundred and thirteen the same Sally Papade
in the north line of the third stem of the second
page was made & crossed as being no part of
my will before the signing thereof

ment & proclaimed the same to be his last will and

testament at the same time they subscribed their names
thereto in presence of the testator & in the presence of
each other at the same time saw Nathan Swanson
& Sally Whalley sign with themselves & they further say
that they believed him to be in his proper senses
sworn & subscribed to in open Court
