

First Will and Testament of Edmond Walker,
State of Georgia; In the name of my Heavenly Father, who having
Morgan County blessed me with the good things of this life, and
a Spirit to praise him in all things, I make this my last will and
testament. Item. 1st. It is my will and desire that my burial
and medical expences be paid first, and then all my just debts
and liabilities next. Item 2nd. It is my will and desire to
provide for the maintenance of my wife Mary Elizabeth Walker
and her two children by me, Elizabeth Mary Walker and Peter Gautier Walker,
first; I leave them my plantation on
Little River, to my wife Mary Elizabeth Walker and her two chil-
dren by me, Elizabeth Mary Walker and Peter Gautier Walker
in joint Stock to be managed by my Executors or Executrix for
their support and maintenance; I also give to my wife Mary
C. Walker, and her two children by me, Elizabeth M. Walker and
Peter C. Walker, One hundred and Thirty two (32) Shares of
Georgia Rail Road Stock, not to be sold or disposed of, but to
be kept in joint Stock, the annual dividends of which, together
with all the supplies made on the plantation are to be equally
divided between my wife Mary C. Elizabeth M. & Peter
C. Walker, so long as the aforesaid Mary C. Walker lives, or remains.

W. Walker, as long as the aforesaid Mary, G. Walker lives, or remains
my widow, if she marries again, her interest in the above named
property returns to her two children, Elizabeth M. & Peter G. Wal-
ker, if said Elizabeth M., or Peter G. Walker, should die without
lawful heirs, I desire everything to remain the same during
my wife's natural life or widowhood; but if either, or both the
aforesaid children, Elizabeth M., or Peter G., should outlive my
wife, Mary, I, they inherit the aforesaid property in full; if
but should they both die without heirs, then it returns to my estate,
to be divided between Leander C. Walker, ~~Hiram Newton~~ and
Richard Denton. I give my wife Mary, & Elizabeth M. and
Peter G. Walker, six Choice Miles and three choice horses, I
leave Flanny Moore and her colt as cold to them in fee simple,
so nine good Milch Cows & Calves, one good Yoke of Oxen, and the
Ox Cart, all the Stock of Sheep and Hogs until Peter G. is twenty
one years of age, the Road Waggon and Harness, and the Small
Waggon & Harness Peter made, to be his own; Also the Buggy and
Harness, the Spring Waggon & Harness, The Big Mule, and Ox Wag-
gons & Fixments; Item, I third, To Jessie, or Elizabeth M. I
give the House & Lots on the City of Madison, with every thing on
them, just as they stand, also Thirty four (34) acres of Wood
Land bought of Joseph Boson, near Madison; When the Said Peter

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I believe. Twenty one (21) years of age, Elizabeth M. Comes into possession of her share of the lands, as follows: my Repton Jones Lot (no. 211) all of the Morrison Jones Lot (no 239) of which I am in possession; that part of the Mooney Lot (no. 212) lying on the left of the Roads to the Swamp, as the road now runs. It is also my desire that my wife, Mary E. Walker, have a home with the said Elizabeth M. in Madison, or with the said Peter, G. Walker at his plantation, as the said Mary, E. may choose, and that Elizabeth M. and Peter, G. Walker be bound for her support so long as she may remain my widow. The Fielder Lot (no 240) I sold to Lebulon Walker, the notes of Lebulon Walker to go to Elizabeth M. as a portion of her part of the estate, and in place of the land which I sold to Lebulon Walker, which he otherwise would have been her part. Item 4th On a division I give to Peter, G. Walker, the following Property, my Home stead on Little River including such house hold and Kitchen furniture as he may need, the surplus to be sold. The Lael Jackson Lot (no. 213.) The whole of the Jackson lot now in my possession (no. 214) The whole of the Halsey Lot (no. 238) all of the Cormichael Lot of which I am possessed. Also that part of it, no. 215.

the swamp pasture, going from the Rock corner of Lots, No. 2,
212, 213, 238 & 239, along the fence which now encloses the pasture
to the Rector Jones Line; also, all of the money lying on the left
hand side of the swamp pasture road, including the road, and
also, the piece of woods known as the Clark's Woods, I give to
him my Silver Watch, my Song Shot Gun, the Corn Sheller, the
New Crescent Saw, the Blacksmiths & Carpenter Tools, One
half of the Cotton Gin I give jointly to Harry E., Elizabeth, Mr.
& Peter G. Walker. The negroes own the other half and have
their notes for it. Item, §th It is my desire that after
all my debts are paid, that the remainder of my estate not
priviously mentioned, including all our plus Staff be
sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between Sonder
^{Q.} Walker, M. Kilgus Newton and Richard Denton, Esq.
has received his share of my estate, and I shall make no
more provision for him, or my Grand Daughter Letitia
Buttle, as they are both dead. Ebion Walker has received
more for his part of my property, than any of my children,
therefore I make no other provision for him, than I have
already made. I give to Kilgus Newton, The Clarkes
Old Place on the other side of the river from my house,

I also desire her to have one share of ^{way 443}Co. Rail Road Stock.
I desire that my collection of Books be equally and mutually
divided with all my children, and not sold.
It is my will that all money in the hands of my Commission Mer-
chants or Co. Rail Road Company be equally divided between
my wife and her two children Elizabeth M. & Peter L. Wal-
ker, Newt., Pth. In consideration of the marriage articles
between the former Mary E. Worley, now my wife, and myself
Almonde Walker, I do hereby say, it was not to dispossess her
of any interest in my estate, but to guard against any
debts that might come against my estate, from her own
debts, or those of her former husband.

I do hereby appoint ^{as my} Dr. Newton & Peter Cauntier Walker, my
lawful Executors to this my last Will and Testament, Revok-
ing all other wills I have made, also removing all disabil-
ties in Peter Cauntier Walker's minority, making him eli-
gible, as though he was twenty one years of age;
In witness whereof, I have set my hand and affixed my
seal, this Seventeenth, 17th day of August, in the year of our
Lord, One Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty eight

In the Name of God Amen I Charles Smith of the County of Morgan
in State of Georgia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind & memory
I make and ordain this to be my last will and testament First It is my
will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian manner
and as touching my worldly affairs wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me
with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner
and form First It is my desire that my executors pay all my just debts out
of the first money that may come into their hands It is my will that all the
property that I have already given to my daughter Susan Walker that she have and
hold the same forever and also the property that I have already given to my
daughter Anna Hanks she shall have and hold the same to her and her heirs
forever and likewise all the property that I have given of to my son Thomas
Smith that he shall have and hold the same After I give unto my
son James C Smith and my two daughters Julia Ann Smith and
Lucia Smith the following Negroes to be equally divided between them

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I send to Jack, Ben, Dickie, Moses, Rubin, Zack, Billy, Tom, Mary, Cynthia
 and her child, Diane, Molly and her child, Billy, Billy and his child Chapman,
 Tempy, and Combia to them and their heirs forever. I give unto my daughter Elvina
 Smith one other negro by the name of Hamah called to her and her heirs forever.
 I also give unto my last two named children all of my household furniture to be
 equally divided between them with exception of one featherbed which I wish to be
 sold at least twenty dollars, that I give unto my granddaughter Sam, I Smith
 to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my two daughters Julia Anne Smith
 and Elvina Smith my last birds dog and hamper to them and their heirs forever.
 Item I leave all of my lands and stock of all kinds etc. hereof given away
 to be sold by my executors and the money arising therefrom after the payment

of my debts to be equally divided between Edmond Walker, Thomas Smith,
William J. Stokes, Sam I. Smith, Julia Anne Smith and Elvina Smith.
 It is my will and desire that if either of my children should die without
 leaving an heir or heirs that the property should in that case be equally divided between
 their surviving brother and sister. And lastly make I appoint Edmond Walker,
Will. J. Stokes, Thomas Smith and Sam I. Smith my executors to the above
 last will and testament reserving all other business made by me. In witness
 I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 1st day of November Eighteen
 hundred and forty six.
