First, I will bequeath unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Ann all of my property of every description
both real & personal after the payment of my just debts
during her life or as long as she remains single and
should she die or marry before my youngest child
becomes twenty years of age it is my will that no
division of the property shall be made until my
youngest child shall become of that age and then
all equally divided among all my children

Second, I hereby constitute and appoint H. M.
Turner my executor for the purpose of executing
this will and for all purposes necessary in
settling my business.
