Know ye that on the third day of December in the year of our
Lord One thousand eight hundred and Forty the last will
and testament of Daniel Pommund, and Administration
of the Estate real and Personal of Daniel Pommund is
granted to William M. Spence of Murray Cty and William
McClung of Campbell Cty. I this day give all the money
arising from the sale of Lot No one hundred and two in the
sixth district of Gormett County, and all the money arising
from the sale of my personal property after my just debts
is paid unto my beloved Wife Sarah Pommund which
the money is to be put out at interest untill her death and
I this day reserve from sale lot No nine in the fourteenth
district of Murray Cty for the use and benefit of my be-
loved Wife which is to be rented and put to her sole use and
I this day reserve from sale one half acre of lot No nine
in the fourteenth district for the use of a burying place
where the bury ground now is. I this day bequeath to my
beloved Wife One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs which
she may do with to her liking and I do reserve from interest
one Note of hand on Samuel Pommund for two hundred
and thirty dollars & 66 Cents which is to be so much of his part
of my estate, and I do bequeath all the bedding and house-
hold furniture for the use of my beloved Wife untill her
death and I do require at the death of my beloved Wife that
Sale be made of Lot No. nine in the fourteenth district it be sold
and an equal divide be made between all my Lawful heirs
And I also bequeath to my beloved Wife fifteen barrels of
good round Corn and two good fat Hogs for her support for
the year Eighteen hundred and forty One

Murray County, Fitzpatrick having the exercise of my proper
senses knowing the certainty of death with all the living and the
uncertainty as to how long before I may be called hence another
world. I am desirous of making a disposition of the Property or effects
I am now in possession of both real and personal
First I will the Spirit or that immortal principle that now tenants
my mortal body to god who gave it. and who rules all things. the
body after death I desire to be buried in decent Christian form
in the place where I now live. Next I will to Ren Fitzpatrick
Kincannon the youngest son of Mary Kincannon his negress
to wit since a man 40 years old Dolly his wife 30 years old Thomas
a boy 16 years old John a boy 15 years old. Jane a girl 6 years old
and Emaline a girl 1 year old. Also the lot of land I now live on
known and distinguished in the Plan of said district by the number
in the 7th district and third Section containing 160 acres more or less. also
Part of lot No 47 lying off the River in Murray County
Originally Cherokee supposed to contain 60 or 70 acres more or less
also lot No 2 in the 7th district 3rd Section of Murray County containing
160 acres more or less. also 1 lot of land No 258 in the 10th dist 3rd
Section lying in Murray County containing 160 acres more or less. also
1 silver watch and shot gun to be kept carefully untill he arrives
to twenty one years of age. said watch and gun to be used by no per-
son. Next I will to Martha Pawkins heirs the sum of 5 dollars
Next I will Cynthia Varner 5 Dollars. Next I will to Nancy
Byram 5 Dollars. next I will that the Property that I have willed
to the said Ren Fitzpatrick Kincannon above named to remain
on the place where I now live untill he arrives to the age of 21 years
who was born the 12th June 1844. Next I will ten dollars a year
in provisions for the support of the said Ren Fitzpatrick Kincannon
yearly untill he arrives at 8 years age. Next I will that con-
cord deer shall be kept constantly on the farm from year to year
who shall be selected by my Executor which I shall hereafter name
etc or appoint. Next I will that if the said Ren Fitzpatrick

Kincannon does not live to the age of 21 years. It is my will
that the above specified property willed to the above Rev. Fitzpatrick
Kincannon shall be equally divided between my two neph-
ews Henry C. Byram and William H. C. Byram. Next I will
that said Rev. Fitzpatrick Kincannon shall remain with his
mother if she see fit to keep him, and if she does not see fit to
do so. It is my will that my sister Nancy Byram should keep
him untill he arrives at the age of eight years. to be paid a
reasonable Compensation for her trouble out of my Estate. then
the said Rev. Fitzpatrick Kincannon shall be put to school
closely untill he arrives at the age of 17 years. at the age
of 17 years he is at his own discretion to commence the study
of a profession and continue at school untill he is 21 years
of age. Next I will that if Property not herein specified is not
sufficient to carry into effect a Settlement of my affairs I
desire that if my Executors find it necessary in said settle-
ment of affairs that they should sell the above named lot of
land 238 13th dist 3rd Section. shall be sold at Public out
cry at the discretion of my Executors. Next I will that my
Executors shall rent the Surplus lands annually what he
may think necessary for the complete support of the above named.
Next I will that my Executor shall keep the Plantation
I now live on in good repair from year to year and especially
the Plantation known by No 67 On Coosawattaw River. Next
I will that all money or monies that will or may Originate
from rents of land and sales of Products &c shall be put at
Interest immediately for the benefit of the said Rev. Fitzpatrick
Kincannon. and should the said Rev. Fitzpatrick Kincan-
on not live to the age of twenty One years. Or should the
said Rev. Fitzpatrick die without issue then the whole and
or as above described shall descend to my two nephews to
wit Henry C. Byram and William H. C. Byram.
Next I will that my Executor shall pay himself for all
necessary trouble that he may be at which shall be a reason-
