this life, deem it right and proper, both as
respects myself and family, that I should make
a disposition of the property with which I am
possessed, do therefore make this my last will
and Testament.

1st Item. I desire and direct that my body be decently buried as my circumstances will admit.

2^d Item. I desire and direct that all my just debts be first paid out of my effects.

3^d Item. I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Martha, two lots of land: Numbers two Hundred and one and two and a half and forty one Eighth District, and third Section, Originally Cherokee now Murray County, Together with all my other property, consisting of hogs, Sheep, Cows, Horses, farming tools, Smith tools, accounts notes, bonds, house hold, & Kitchen furniture, To have and to hold and contrall to her own use & benefit during her natural life, and no longer.

4" Item. After the death of my wife Martha, I desire and direct that all my property be equally divided between my children, namely, Franklin F. Hall, Emily F. Hall, Robert L. Hall, William F. Hall, Thos. H. Hall, Van Buren Hall, Joseph N. H. Hall,

5th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my be-
loved wife Martha Exonatrice and my worthy friend
William Suffoxen, Executors of the my last will
and Testament. This March 31st 1857.
