our lord eighteen hundred and fifty (1850) September 8th
I George Black having a disease and believing that my stay
on earth will be short and being in my proper reason and
sound mind. have a desire to dispose of my personal and pen-
sible property after Committing my Soul to God who gave it
and my body to be decently buried Item 1st I bequeath to
my loving wife Jane 1 lot of land in the 25th district 2nd section
No 52 or part of said lot One hundred twenty acres to hold and to
have and all appurtenances thereto. during her life time. and
afterwards to be divided equally among my Children except
my daughter Sarah. I want her Children to have her part
Item 2nd I bequeath my yellow mare to my wife Jane also my
house hold furniture two Cows and Calves also my hogs a suffi-
ency for her use also my stock Item 3rd my River land No 234
in the 8th District 2nd section 1 lot to be divided among
my Children equally except my daughter Sarah. her Children
to have part. Item 4th I bequeath to my daughters Ruth and Mal-
ised my Sorrel Mare also two Cows and Calves to be divided equally
Item 5th I bequeath to my daughter Jane my Clay Bank Cult
Item 6th I bequeath to my son Fory my Sorrel Cult Item 7th
I bequeath to my wife the balance of my Black Cattle
also bequeath to my wife Jane my present Crop of Corn and
my home place and the rest of my River land for this year
also my farming tools this is a true desire of my will where-
fore I set my hand and Seal day and date above written
September 8th 1850 Signed sealed and witnessed
