tract and ordain the following my last will and test-
ament: First I will and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Elizabeth Anderson all the land that is in my
possession or that may be at my death, of lots of land
Nos ninety nine and 100 and hundred in the 2nd
District & Third Section, also all the household &
kitchen furniture and all the stock that may
belong to me at my death.

2nd It is my will that until the death of my wife
or during her widowhood, then at the death of my
wife or in case she should marry, the above land
and property to be equally divided between my
daughters Martha Anthony Don Nathaniel Anderson legal heirs, I in case that my daughter
Martha Anthony should die without any legal
heirs then her portion to go to the heirs of my
son Nathaniel Anderson legal heirs.

3rd It is my will that lot of land number one
hundred and fourteen in the ninth District
Section at my death be sold and the proceeds of the
sale to be equally divided between my beloved
Nathaniel A. Anderson and my beloved daughter
Cleveland and said beloved son N. A. Anderson
to have the benefit of the said division
his life then to be distributed to his legal
my grand children.

4th Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint
my beloved wife Elizabeth Anderson and my
beloved William Anderson & James Anderson
my executors.
