I James Tickett being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and declare this my last will.

Item first It is my wish to be buried in a Christian like manner

Item second It is my will all my just debts be paid Item third It is my will that the marriage contract entered into between myself and my wife Belverida and Thomas Holcombe be complied with according to said agreement, which is recorded at Greenville Co., N. C. S. S.

Item fourth I bequeath to my three children John Murray and Elizabeth all my house hold and Kitchen holding and bed clothing and also all my corn and wheat and Bacon and lard and all my growing crop and also my carriage and two horses and also all my stock of cattle, pigs and sheep, all to aid the raising of the children as above and also they children may occupy my dwelling house until the children John Murray and Elizabeth shall become of legal age. And that if my beloved wife Belverida sees cause she may occupy the west end of my house with John Murray and Elizabeth shall become of age. But if my wife Belverida do not live in the west end of said house she shall not have power to sell it or part it out.

Item fifth It is my will that the David Garrison plantation and also the bottom land of the John Davis tract and so much of my house best

as can be cultivated by my negroes shall be for the use of raising my children, John, Mary & Elizabeth, and that no land shall be cleared, except that on the David Garrison tract on the North side of the [redacted] and as tenants on a grand soil shall not clear my land nor waste the timber but they shall burn old dry dead timber and burn no green timber, and keep the fencing repaired on their own expenses, and also pay two dollars per acre sent annually or move off and let the land be idle.

Item sixth I give my son John Holcombe Dickett all that tract of land on Pinhook farm in Stewart County containing six hundred and fifty odd acres and also two hundred and two and one half acres ~~at~~ ^{Murray County Wills 1840-1872} ~~and~~ ^{surplus and also} stock and ~~and~~ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Item seventh I give to my daughter Mary Holcombe Dickett all my tract of land in Stewart County Georgia on Laubabia joining of Bell mills containing four hundred and fifty odd acres and also Hamet and Joe and also six thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item eighth I give to my daughter Elizabeth Holcombe Dickett all my land in Greenville District ~~in~~ ^{say} the Sherman and John Davis tracts and also ~~the~~ my house tract known as John Dickey's tract and also Lewis Rice and David Garrison tract and also John F. Farmer and James W. Roberts tracts of land, and also Burdett and Bent fort and Synthe and Oregon forge and also four thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

I am Smith after the above different items are performed then I bestow all the residue both real and personal to be equally divided betwixt my beloved wife Belverida and my three children John, Mary and Elizabeth; but at the death of my beloved wife Belverida this portmaw, my wife shall be equally divided betwixt my children John Mary and Elizabeth.

I am Smith It is my will and wish that all the money bestowed to my three children John Mary and Elizabeth shall be kept at legal interest until they are of legal age.

I am Smith, I constitute and appoint my nephew James B. Mobley, Micajah B. Pickett and my dear relation Joseph Woodward and Moses H. Mobley my executors to this, my will and former wills by me made and this my will to be executed.
