I hereby make my last will and Testament,
1st I will and bequeath unto my wife Lydia
Humphreys all my property both real and personal
to be hers during her natural life time, and
further I will that she be not compelled to give
security for the good coming of the said prop-
erty. 2nd I will and bequeath at the death of
my wife that all my real and personal property
be equally divided between my two children
Laura I Johnson, and David G. Humphreys,
3rd I appoint my son David G. Humphreys
my sole Executor with that he shall not be compelled
to give security for the good coming of the said prop-
erty inasmuch as I am fully and entirely in whole I place
the utmost confidence to carry out my last
will and Testament which is equal justice to all
March the 10th 1824.

H. Disher & David L. Richardson do so likewise
