me; do therefore, make this my last will and testament
humbly revoking all others heretofore made by me.
1. Item, I desire and direct that my body be buried in
a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my
condition and circumstances in life. My soul I
trust, shall return to rest with God who gave it
and hope for eternal salvation through the merits
and atonement of the blessed Sord and Savious Jesus
Christ, whose religion I have professed and
and humbly taught enjoyed for twenty six years.
2. Item, I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my executors hereinafter
appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should
be delayed in their rights especially as there is
now security for delay.

3. Item, I give bequests and devise to my beloved
wife Elizabeth, with whom I have lived on the

strict quiet-for thirty three years, lots of land Nos 158 & 151 in the Ninth District and third section of Murray County including all the improvements wherein I now live, and all that portion of lot of land No 152 which lies east of the mouth of Wilsons Spring Branch an Mill Creek, thence running due south through said lot to where it strikes the south line of said lot, which she is to have and possess during her natural lifetime or widowhood, also my negro man Guilford, and my negro Woman Charlott, together with such a portion of my stock as she may think sufficient to carry on the farm with, all the farming utensils, Household and Kitchen furniture, wagon and yoke of Oxen, my wife is to keep with her all of my minor children, Support and educate them until the become of age, from the time of my death above described property, and at her Death (or should she marry again) then all the property which I have bequeathed to my wife I desire should be sold and the proceeds equally divided amongst all my children, also all the balance of my possession which has not been disposed of in the above bequests, to be sold at the same time, and the proceeds be equally divided as above designated, but until the balance of my farm shall be sold, my executors to have the same out as in their judgment may seem just, and applying the proceeds to the liquidating the estate, having given all the balance of my sons, a Horse, I now give and bequeath to my son Ralph, a young filly, which is about two years old all the balance of my perishable property not heretofore disposed of, to be brought to sale as practicable by my executors, and the proceeds used to the payment of my just debts that of my
